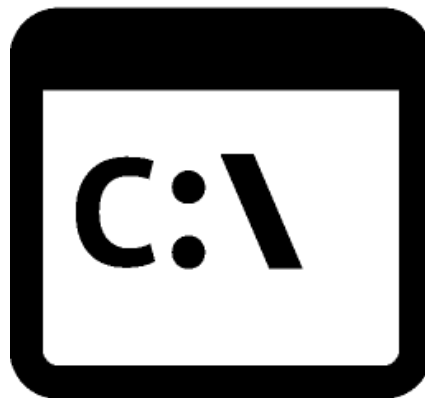

1 General

The BatchXpert system incorporates an “File Purger”, that allows to find and delete obsolete files and delete them, based on certain criteria. These same Command line options are used by the BatchXpert Automatic Backup strategy that can optionally be deployed to every BatchXpert Station.

1 Command line Options

The following Command line options are implemented in the Application

1.1 -bxdef

Checks and deletes the specified files (“FilePattern”) based on the default BatchXpert file purging rules, that include checking for Filecount, Filedate and maintaining a minimum free disk space

1.2 -filecount

Checks and deletes the specified files (“FilePattern”) based on the amount of files found. If there are more files found than the specific amount, it deletes them, while maintaining a minimum file count.

1.2.1 -MaxFileCountToKepp={number}

If more files than this are found, they are deleted, but maintaining at least “MinFilecountToKepp” and considering the “MinAge”.

1.2.2 -MinAge={days}

If a file is younger than “MinAge”, it will not be deleted

1.2.3 -MinFilecountToKepp={number}

At least this amount of files will be kept

1.3 filedate

Checks and deletes the specified files (“FilePattern”) based on the age of files found. If there are files older than the specified age, these files will be deleted.

1.3.1 -MaxAge={days}

If files are found older than “MaxAge” they will be deleted

1.3.2 -MinFileCount = {number}

At least this amount of files will be kept

1.4 -freespace

Checks and maintains at least an certain amount of free disk space.

1.5 -filepattern

Specifies the path and pattern of files to consider. It takes an default windows "Wildcarded" format, such as "C:\Batckup*.txt"

1.6 -includesubdirectories

Also subdirectories of the specified filepattern will be included.
